Thank you for your interest in applying to become a College Bound Opportunities (CBO) Scholar. CBO is a not-for-profit organization providing qualified students from Buffalo Grove High School (BGHS), Cristo Rey St. Martin (CRSM), Deerfield High School (DHS), Highland Park High School (HPHS), Lake Forest High School (LFHS) and Vernon Hills High School (VHHS), with personal mentoring, academic support, career preparation, and financial support as needed while in college, to ensure every CBO Scholar graduates college. In the eighteen years since its founding, CBO has assisted nearly 500 students in realizing their goal of a college education.

CBO welcomes all qualified applicants (US citizenship not required). To qualify to become a CBO Scholar, you must:

- Be a high school sophomore attending BGHS, CRSM, DHS, HPHS, LFHS or VHHS
- Have a strong academic record with a GPA of a B or better
- Demonstrate real financial need

If you are selected as a CBO Scholar, CBO staff will help you and your family complete college, financial aid, and scholarship applications and will work with you and your family to help you determine which college is the best fit for you, academically, socially, culturally and financially. Additionally, you will be paired with a CBO mentor who will help guide you through your high school and college years. CBO staff and your mentor will continue to assist you during your years in college.

CBO also offers its scholars the opportunity to earn financial support (on an as-needed basis). This financial support is renewable each year of college providing you maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 and carry the minimum number of credit hours each semester to ensure you graduate college in four years.

Please note: CBO Scholars are required to attend and live at a four-year college/university. We do not financially support students who attend community college or those who live at home while attending a four-year school.

Before completing this application, please read the attached CBO High School and College Contract (pages 15 & 16) to which all recipients must adhere during high school and college in order to maintain their eligibility in CBO and financial support privileges.

- Fill out all pages of the application in their entirety, *including the two (2) essay questions on page 10.* All information must be filled in or the application will not be considered. If an item is not applicable, write N/A.
- 2. Materials to submit with your application:
 - A counselor recommendation (see page 13) and a teacher recommendation (see page 14). Your counselor and teacher should email their recommendations to Orlando Chavez, CBO College Access Associate, at orlando@cbo4success.org. **To give your recommenders plenty of time to write your recommendations, please request your recommendations no later than 2 weeks before the deadline of May 9, 2025.
 - An unofficial transcript through 1st semester of your sophomore year
 - A copy of your *parents'* most recent tax return(s) (2024 preferred). Due to new rules for filing financial aid forms, please note:
 - > If your parents are married and file a joint tax return, please submit their one tax return
 - If your parents are married and file separate tax returns, please submit the tax returns for each parent
 - If your parents are unmarried and file separate tax returns, please submit the tax returns for each parent
 - > If your parents are divorced, please submit the tax returns for **each** parent
 - > If you are unable to provide tax returns please provide a brief explanation as to why not
 - A copy of *your* most recent tax return (if applicable)

All supporting documents must be submitted by the deadline, Friday, May 9, 2025, or your application will not be considered. Late applications will not be accepted.

- CBO is a highly competitive program and not all applicants can be offered a place within CBO. Applicants will be notified about their selection in mid-July, 2025, *AFTER* CBO reviews your official transcript from both freshman and sophomore year.

All CBO Scholars must:

- 1. Have a mentor. CBO will assign you a mentor, who along with the CBO staff, will assist you with your college search, application and financial aid processes, as well as monitor your progress while you are in college.
- 2. Maintain a GPA of 2.8 or higher while in high school.
- 3. You may not drop a class without first consulting with CBO staff and your counselor.

While in college, CBO Scholars must:

- 1. Maintain a minimum G.P.A. of 2.0. Carry the minimum number of credit hours within your major each semester that keeps you on track to graduate in four years. You may not drop a class without first consulting with CBO staff and/or your college advisor.
- 2. Live on campus for your first two years of college.
- 3. Provide CBO the following information whenever asked:
 - Login to college portal
 - > Grade Status
 - Financial Aid Status
- 4. When borrowing monies for college, utilize only Stafford Subsidized and Unsubsidized loans or School-based loans whenever possible. *Review all loans with a member of the CBO staff before signing any loan documents.*
- 5. Apply early for work-study on campus. If a work-study job is not available, secure a part-time job within the campus community.
- 6. Work during summer vacation, so as to save money and be able to contribute to your own college educational expenses.
- 7. When home on breaks and summer vacations, participate in all CBO workshops and meetings designed specifically for CBO college students.
- 8. When home on breaks and summer vacations, be available to meet with younger CBO students to share experiences and knowledge.
